

Art and creative expression can help us see the world differently by boosting creativity, curiosity, critical thinking, emotional expression and imagination.

STUDYING THE IMPACT OF ART EDUCATION ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE

ALPHABETICA is exploring in depth how the arts and art education can help children and young people develop important skills. For this, arts-based activities are being co-created with students, teachers, and educators: 12 pilot actions are implemented in different settings, designed to see how using art in education impacts students' learning and personal growth. In some pilots, whole classes of students take part, while in others, the focus is on young people from disadvantaged backgrounds, aiming to create new ways to reduce educational inequality and support all children's right to learn through the arts.



SPREADING THE TRANSFORMATIVE EFFECT OF ARTS-BASED EDUCATION AND YOUTH PARTICIPATION FAR AND WIDE

ALPHABETICA is all about ensuring that the knowledge, methodologies, and lessons learned from the research and participatory work reach as many people as possible.

Reports, policy briefs, handbooks, training tools, methodological toolkits, recommendations, roadmaps, and even a manifesto of the principles for an inclusive arts-based school will be part of the pool of materials that will be provided by ALPHABETICA for having farreaching implications across scientific, political, and educational domains.
